### Unisys Operations Sentinel editions

Unisys Operations Sentinel is a comprehensive solution that helps you manage, automate and simplify operations of your enterprise-wide IT infrastructure. As a fully featured solution, Operations Sentinel automates, consolidates access, monitors and manages multiple heterogeneous systems.

Unisys offers the following licensing options:

- Basic Edition
- Department Edition
- Enterprise Edition

#### Basic Edition

Basic Edition is included in all ClearPath® OS 2200 Integrated Operating Environments (IOE) and Unisys Operating Environments (UOE). It is designed to manage one ClearPath operating environment, including specialty partitions. The Basic Edition supports 20 Windows® and 50 Linux® systems. Customers desiring support for additional Windows and Linux operating systems should evaluate the Department or Enterprise Edition based on their requirements.

The Basic Edition is included with all the ClearPath OS 2200 operating systems. Additional licenses can be ordered as needed.

Basic Edition is not included in the ClearPath MCP IOE and UOE operating environments. However, you can request Operations Sentinel Basic Edition with your IOE and UOE software orders at no cost, which is highly recommended. You can upgrade from a Basic Edition to the Department Edition to Enterprise Edition.

#### Department Edition

Department Edition manages up to 45 Windows systems, 75 Linux systems and other systems in addition to the OS 2200 and MCP, and specialty partition connections are not counted toward the connection limit.

If you already have a Basic Edition installed on an OS 2200 or MCP system, this is not counted toward the limit.

Department Edition provides more flexibility than Basic Edition. You can upgrade from a Department Edition to an Enterprise Edition.

#### Enterprise Edition

Enterprise Edition manages an unlimited number of Windows, Linux and other systems in addition to the OS 2200, MCP and specialty partitions for which you have Single Point Operations Interface installed.

Enterprise Edition provides the most flexibility of all the editions. It is only limited by the capacity and performance server or client where the Operations Sentinel software resides.

### Example configurations

The following examples show how Operations Sentinel can be licensed in heterogeneous environments. These configurations can be helpful to review to understand the Operations Sentinel licensing policies better.

#### One Operations Sentinel license

The managed system count is the sum of all Windows systems, Linux systems or systems connected through SSH or telnet-enabled devices that are actively being managed. The Department Edition can be used for configurations that have more than 45 Windows and 75

Linux systems, provided that no more than 45 Windows and 75 Linux systems are being managed at any one time.

## Two Operations Sentinel licenses running independently

The managed system count is separate for each license, even if there are systems that are managed from both licenses. For example, license "A" is managing 30 Windows systems; license "B" is managing 50 Windows systems.

License "A" can use Department Edition, whereas license "B" must use Enterprise Edition, even though the combined total of managed systems is under 100.

## Resilient or backup Operations Sentinel licenses

In a heterogeneous environment, one Operations Sentinel license can be configured as a hot standby backup to the other. Or you could have two licenses running independently, backing up each other. In these cases, the backup capability is not figured into the individual managed system count.

For example, license "A" manages 40 Windows systems and is the backup for license "B." License "B" manages 60 Windows systems and is the backup for license "A." License "A" can use the Department Edition (40 primary connections), while license "B" requires the Enterprise Edition (60 primary connections). In the case of the backup situation, if "A" needs to take over "B," then it can only manage 45 Windows concurrent systems. If that is not enough, then both "A" and "B" need Enterprise Edition.

## Licensing policies

Unisys Operations Sentinel versions running on Windows are available as a standard five-year Extended Term Policy for the base products.

- A separately purchased copy of Operations Sentinel is required for each Operations Sentinel server on which the product is installed. This is applicable even if Operations Sentinel is being used in a resilient configuration.
- If moving Operations Sentinel to a new system, you must uninstall the product from the old system.
- There are no separately priced and licensed features for Operations Sentinel.
- There are no software license keys to be obtained or entered.
